## Disconnected Phone Breaks With Policy

"I left my telephone receiver off the hook by accident one afternoon and went out. When I returned, an employee of the General Telephone Co. had been to my home to investigate and had then disconnected my telephone. I have a private line. When I protested, he said that if he had not disconnected my line, all of the condensers would have been blown out all along the lines and other telephones burned out. Was the employee carrying out company policy or simply performing at his own discretion?"—Mrs. Robert J. Jackson.

**Troubleshooter:** Murray M. MacDonald, Halls Lake district manager for the General Telephone Co. of Northwest, Inc., replies that "it is not our practice to disconnect a private line when this problem arises."

"Our employee's statement was, in this case, inaccurate and does not reflect company policy," MacDonald adds.

## Blue Ribbon Threadbare?

"I am mystified. Gov. Dan Evans has appointed 29 members to a Committee on Law and Justice whose duty it is to advise the governor on the development of state-wide law-enforcement plans under the Crime Control and Safe Street Acts of 1968. There is every conceivable interest in the law-enforcement and related fields represented on the committee except there is no representative of the Seattle Police Department. How can such a committee be representative when the state's largest city police force facing the largest and most serious crime problems is not even on it?"—S.D.

**Troubleshooter:** The governor is convinced the blue-ribbon panel of experts has adequate police representation from Tacoma and Auburn, the sheriff's offices of King and Chelan Counties, the State Patrol and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

## Advice Lent Free of Charge

"Where may a person obtain reliable free advice in the Seattle area on how to get out of debt? We are deeply in debt and can't seem to get a beginning on getting out."—Troubled.

**Troubleshooter:** There is a no-cost service of this nature sponsored by Consumer Credit Counseling Service of Seattle, Inc., at 2404 Third Ave. Personal debt is a burden that can be made worse by garnishment of wages and salaries.

Consumer Credit Counseling Service is a nonprofit community-service agency that specializes in money-management advice. The important point is that such counseling be obtained before the emergency becomes worse. (See Boyd Burchard's column for other details, Page 66.)

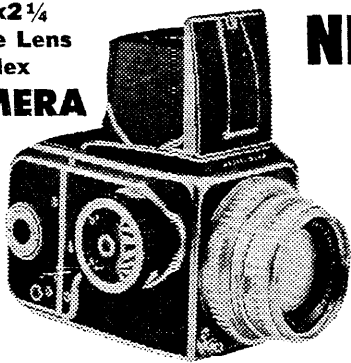

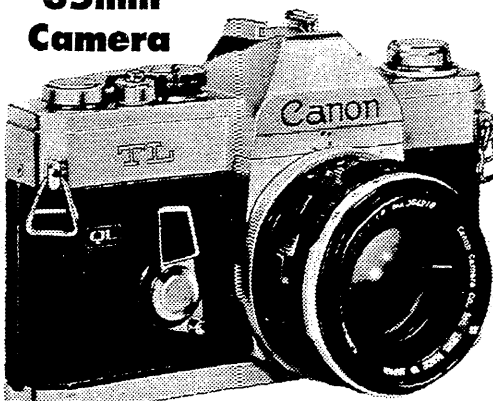

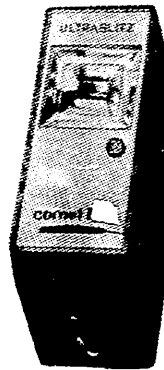
