<b>Why do you want to serve on this board or commission?</b>					
<p>As a Commissioner, I can make valuable contributions to the public policy and sound scientific management of fish and wildlife in Washington. I am a life-long hunter and fisherman and have resided, hunted, and fished in Washington since 1983, when I arrived to attend graduate school at the College of Forest Resources of the University of Washington. I received my Ph.D. in Forest Science, with emphasis in wildlife and conservation science, from the UW in 1989. I am a strong believer in collaborative efforts, and have led or worked on many committees and teams of professionals and the public with divergent interests. I am committed to fostering both consumptive uses (e.g., hunting &amp; fishing) and non-consumptive biodiversity aspects of wildlife management. We desperately need a new policy and funding paradigms in fish and wildlife management that focus on fish and wildlife's contributions to a high quality of life for all Washington citizens.</p> <p>From 1989 to 2013, I worked as a research wildlife biologist for the US Forest Service's Pacific Northwest Research Station: six years in Olympia working in western Washington and 19 years in Wenatchee working on eastern Washington wildlife. My field of research integrated wildlife management with the restoration management of dry forests in eastern Washington. I worked collaboratively on many team projects with managers and scientists from the Forest Service, the University of Washington, the Washington Dept. of Fish and Wildlife, the Dept. of Natural Resources, and non-governmental organizations. I studied a broad variety of wildlife and their habitats, including forest birds, small mammals, elk and deer, and spotted owls. I published over 100 journal and tech transfer publications. I retired from the Forest Service in January 2013, but am still keen to contribute to the sound management of wildlife and their habitats.</p> <p>I am involved in several civic groups in Wenatchee and Washington state. I have been serving on the Wildlife Diversity Advisory Council to the WA Dept. Fish &amp; Wildlife since 2016. I chaired the council in 2017. I have been a member of the Chelan-Douglas Land Trust for about 15 years, was Board President from 2016-2018, and currently am a Trustee on the Board and chair the Stewardship Committee. I served on the board of Appleatchee Riders Association in Wenatchee, probably the largest horse club in Washington, for 5 years and chaired the team sorting division from 2010 - 2020. I also served several years on the board of the Okanogan Valley Cutters (horse) club.</p> <p>In sum, I have strong wildlife science and management credentials and am a team player. I have deep roots in Washington's wildlife and am committed to its sound management.</p> <p>NB: I submitted this same application in early January 2021, but I received a computer error with my attached CV, so am submitting it again after not getting confirmation from the boards and commission office.</p>
